Behavior During the Consecration

More than a few people have expressed surprise and concern at the movement, noise and commotion that occurs frequently during the Consecration of the Mass! This is the most solemn moment in the entire Mass, when the people of God, having placed their offerings upon the altar, await the Consecration when the priest transforms their offerings into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, and offers this sublime gift to the Heavenly Father. This solemn moment requires our full attention and reverence. It is a time when we all kneel and focus on what Christ is doing through the ministry of his priest; a time when we humble ourselves before the mighty works of God as he bestows his greatest blessing upon us, his own Son, Jesus Christ.

When I was a boy, we even used kneel in the confession line at the words of consecration. The only movement was the occasional rustling of little child who was quickly corralled. It was not the time for trips to the bathroom or questions of mom. It was a solemn moment, and the very reason for our sanctuary bells is to call us to attention.

We need to renew our devotion to Jesus Christ, the Son of God, really present in the Eucharist. As Pope John Paul II said in Ireland, our Catholic Faith can be summed up as our Faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. We need to guard the very moment of this miracle with the greatest reverence.

North Dakota bishops: don't fund groups advocating for abortion, contraception.

FARGO, North Dakota, March 11, 2011 (LifeSiteNews.com) - Catholics should not offer financial support to groups that promote abortion, contraception, or same-sex "marriage," including Planned Parenthood supporter Susan G. Komen for the Cure, the North Dakota Catholic Conference said Wednesday.

Bishops Paul A. Zipfel of Bismarck and Samuel J. Aquila of Fargo issued the statement at the start of the Catholic Lenten season, Ash Wednesday, to warn against donating to groups "whose mission or affiliation may be morally objectionable or, at least, questionable."

"All human life is sacred and must be protected. This is why we should not support or endorse individuals and organizations that provide, promote, or advocate for abortion, contraception, reproductive rights 'family planning,' or embryonic stem cell research," wrote the bishops.

Because marriage is "the foundation of the family and, therefore, essential to the common good," Catholics also should be sure not to support "individuals and organizations that seek to redefine marriage or whose activities devalue its importance."

"When evaluating the appropriateness of participating in, publicizing, or otherwise providing support to a fundraising effort, Catholic entities should consider whether the mission and activities of the organization are consistent with Catholic teaching, particularly as it pertains to human life and marriage," they note.

The statement goes on to list several organizations with questionable ties, including the March of Dimes, which supports embryonic stem-cell research and mandatory contraception insurance coverage, and Susan G. Komen for the Cure, which funds Planned Parenthood.

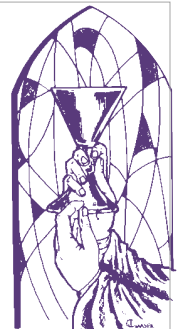

- More than 50% of adult food shelf visitors are employed and 65% make less than \$1000.00 a month, not enough income to cover their basic needs.
- In 2010, there were more than three million food shelf visits statewide and 63 million pounds of food were distributed to Minnesota families by food shelves.
- Hunger touches people of every age: 56% of food shelf visitors are families with children and 20% are seniors.
- From 2000 to 2010, food shelf usage has tripled!

Pro-Life Corner

The 40 Days for Life prayer campaign that organizers say has helped close down nine abortion centers starts on Ash-Wednesday in hundreds of cities and towns across the U.S. with people praying at abortion facilities. The campaign also stretches to parts of Canada, England and Australia as pro-life advocates in other nations have hopped on board after seeing the success in the United States. Since 40 Days for Life began as a national - and then international - effort in 2007, more than 400,000 people have participated and confirmed reports have documented that 3,599 babies have been saved from abortion.
